William H. Buckman installed on board of directors of nation's top criminal defense organization

Washington D.C. — At the annual meeting of the National Association of Criminal Defense Lawyers last week in Denver, William H. Buckman, a Moorestown, New Jersey defense attorney, was sworn in to his second term as a member of the NACDL board of directors.

A life member of the organization, Buckman currently co-chairs the Law Enforcement Misconduct Committee and Long Range Planning Committee. He is also a member of the Nominating Committee.
