Hernandez installed as President-Elect of Nation's largest criminal defense bar

Miami, Fla. (July 29) – Carmen D. Hernandez, a federal criminal practitioner in Washington, D.C., was sworn in as President-Elect of the National Association of Criminal Defense Lawyers (NACDL) July 29, at the Association's Annual Meeting in Miami Beach. Hernandez served last year as first vice president, and previously served as a member of the Board of Directors. She has also chaired the NACDL Continuing Legal Education Committee and co-chaired the Federal Sentencing Committee.

Hernandez is a nationally-recognized expert on the federal sentencing guidelines and the author of numerous articles on the ins and outs of federal sentencing practice. A former federal public defender in Maryland, she received NACDL's top member honor, the *Robert C. Heeney Award*, in 2003 for her outstanding service to the criminal defense bar, as well as the Champion of the Constitution Award from the Federal Defenders.
